PUBLIC NOTICE

Chesterfield J&DR District Court will begin hearing anything previously scheduled and docketed for a hearing dated May 18, 2020 and beyond.

- If you had a case set for a hearing on May 18, 2020, or after, your case will be heard on the date previously scheduled, unless you receive Notice of a change in hearing date/time from the Sheriff.
- If you had a case set for a hearing from March 16, 2020, through May 15, 2020, the Clerk's Office is rescheduling your case and you will receive Notice from the Sheriff's Office.

Considerations:

- If you are ill, have traveled within the last fourteen (14) days to an area where widespread transmission of COVID-19 has been reported, have been knowingly exposed to someone who has COVID-19, or have been diagnosed yourself with COVID-19, please do not come to the courthouse. Email or call for instruction.
- The Court is able to hold remote hearings by telephone and videoconference. Please see the <u>court's website</u> for additional information regarding remote hearing capability and how to request one. <u>You must file a Motion</u> for a Remote Hearing in order to be heard remotely. Please note: the court cannot provide troubleshooting or technical support to parties appearing remotely via videoconferencing. It is incumbent upon each party to test and troubleshoot the chosen videoconferencing application prior to the remote hearing.
- The Chesterfield Sheriff's Office is temperature screening all visitors to the courthouse. Screeners are masked and gloved.
 - If anyone is turned away for having a temperature at or above 100 degrees who is also a participant in a hearing, the Sheriff's Office will immediately advise the presiding judge. Such persons *may* still participate in a scheduled hearing by telephone from outside the courthouse at the discretion of the presiding judge.
- The Clerk's Office will be seeing the public by appointment only. If you cannot conduct your business remotely and need to be waited on in-person, please see the Clerk's Office appointment sign up genius.
 - If you have an appointment and are turned away for having a temperature at or above 100 degrees, or for answering yes to any exclusionary question, please call or email the Clerk for a new appointment.

- While not required, it is strongly encouraged that you wear a mask and/or gloves to Court. The Court does not have a supply of masks or gloves for the public, so if you want to wear them, you will need to bring your own. The Court will have hand sanitizer stations throughout the courthouse.
- Please refrain from bringing children or other spectators with you to Court. While most J&DR court hearings are confidential, adult criminal and certain other proceedings are public; however, we will be limiting spectators if the number of *required persons* in any given trial exceeds the maximum number of people allowed in a courtroom, in order to comply with social distancing. Children are *always welcome with parents*, but please practice good judgment and try to find alternative childcare *if possible* during this time.
- Any inquiries should be directed to the Clerk of Court, Laura G. Griffin at <u>lgriffin@vacourts.gov</u>. You may also call the Court at 804-748-1379, but please expect longer than usual wait times. We encourage all to use email, where possible. Most matters can be handled remotely.
- The Court will begin to accept all non-essential, non-emergent filings effective May 18, 2020.
- Attorneys who need assistance from the Clerk's Office, including access to files, may seek assistance remotely, or in person. The attorney workroom will be available for use by attorneys.
