XI. PREPAYABLE OFFENSES AND UNIFORM FINE SCHEDULE

The Supreme Court of Virginia publishes the prepayable offenses and uniform fine schedule in Rules of Court 3B:2 and in Rules of Court 3C:2 of the [Rules of Virginia Supreme Court](#). Rules of Court 3B:2 contains the schedule for traffic offenses, and Rules of Court 3C:2 contains the schedule for non-traffic offenses. To calculate the amount of the fines in prepayment cases, the magistrate must refer to Volume 11 of the Code of Virginia for these two rules of court.

To search prepayable offenses on-line, please follow these procedures:

- Step 2** Press Control (CTRL) key and the letter F, or select Search icon on tool bar.
