News America Marketing, Inc. and its insurer (hereinafter referred to as "employer") appeal a decision of the Workers' Compensation Commission awarding temporary total disability benefits to Cheryl A. Deans beginning May 5, 2005. Employer contends the commission erred in (1) permitting Deans to submit records post-hearing concerning her marketing efforts while prohibiting employer from challenging those records; (2) refusing to allow employer to submit after-discovered evidence pursuant to the commission's Rule 3.3; and (3) finding Deans proved she suffered a change-in-condition entitling her to an award of benefits. We have reviewed the record and the commission's opinion, and we hold that this appeal is without merit. Accordingly, we affirm the commission's decision for the reasons stated by the commission in its final opinion. See Deans v. News America Marketing, Inc., VWC File
