Michael Anderson appeals a decision of the Workers' Compensation Commission finding he failed to prove that he was entitled to (1) a change in treating physicians; and (2) temporary total disability benefits from December 16, 2005 through February 22, 2006. We have reviewed the record and the commission's opinion and find that this appeal is without merit. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the commission in its final opinion. See Anderson v.
