American Airlines, Inc./AMR Corporation and its insurer appeal a decision of the Workers' Compensation Commission (1) awarding temporary total disability benefits, temporary partial disability benefits, and medical benefits to Eton Anthony Thomas, Jr. (claimant), (2) finding that claimant established a change in condition, (3) finding that claimant was entitled to periods of temporary partial disability benefits, and (4) finding that claimant adequately marketed his residual work capacity. We have reviewed the record and the commission's opinion and find no reversible error. Accordingly, we affirm for the reasons stated by the commission in its final opinion. See American Airlines, Inc./AMR Corporation v. Thomas, VWC File No. 198-15-85 (Nov. 17, 2003). We dispense with oral argument and summarily
