PAGE COUNTY GENERAL DISTRICT COURT PAYMENT AGREEMENT FOR THE COLLECTION OF FINE AND COSTS EFFECTIVE JULY 1, 2025

The form DC-210 is an agreement that is used to inform the defendant of the amount they owe and explain that their case will be referred for collection enforcement action if the court does not receive payments as ordered. By signing this agreement, the defendant acknowledges that he/she is aware of what will happen if he/she defaults. All restitution amounts are entered on a separate payment schedule as entered by the court.

A one-time fee of \$10.00 will be assessed per VA Code 19.2-354, unless time to pay needed is less than 90 days.

If the defendant has defaulted on a previous TTP agreement, a defendant can become eligible to enter a new TTP agreement a down payment is required and will be as follows:

Amount owed \$500 or less - a down payment of 10% of the total owed.

Amount owed \$500.00 or more – a down payment of 5% of the total amount owed or \$50.00, whichever is greater.

To be eligible to extend an existing payment plan - a down payment is required and will be as follows:

Amount owed \$500 or less – a down payment of 10% of the total owed.

Amount owed \$500 or more – a down payment of 5% of the total amount owed or \$50.00, whichever is greater

Any defendant who cannot pay within 90 days is offered an alternate payment plan as outlined below:

Deferred Payment Plans

\$0.01-\$999.99- 6 months

\$1,000.00-\$1,999.99- 1 year

\$2,000.00 and above- 1 year

For Community service: Up to one half of your total fines and costs due to this court may be discharged by performing community service at the Virginia rate of minimum wage of \$12.00 per hour. Community service cannot be performed in lieu of paying restitution owed. Only the Judge can authorize this request, and it must be made in writing. When completion of hours has been reached, this court will need a letter from the agency or organization on letterhead showing a detailed number of hours completed to credit the case.

In accordance with 19.2-354 and 19.2-354.1 where the court is informed that a defendant's sole financial income is Social Security or SSI, the defendant shall be exempt from making payments on fines and costs. Restitution payments are NOT exempt and must be paid as ordered by the Court.

The defendant must promptly notify the court of any change of address during the term of the payment agreement.
