Pursuant to Virginia Supreme Court Order of June 1, 2020, the declaration of judicial emergency has been extended through June 28, 2020.

Courthouse Visitors

Screening of visitors to the courthouse will continue by means of temperature scanning and questionnaire regarding potential COVID-19 exposure. Additionally, pursuant to the above noted order: **All persons aged ten (10) and older must wear a face covering that covers the nose and mouth when entering the Chesterfield Courthouses. It is expected that visitors will supply their own face covering; however, the Courts will provide disposable masks for those visitors who do not have their own. Individuals without a face mask will not be permitted to enter the courthouse except for those who cannot safely wear a face mask because of a health-related condition.**

Clerk's Office Operations

Effective Monday, June 8, 2020, appointments will not be required for all in-person transactions. With the exception of full probate and/or qualification matters and marriage licenses, walk-in customers will be allowed (including the Record Room). However, office capacity restrictions and social distancing may result in wait times for assistance. Therefore, during the state of judicial emergency, all remote business options will remain available and customers are encouraged to utilize these options as they are able. These options currently include drop box, online payments, eRecording, fax, email and telephonic assistance. **Effective 7/1/20, fax and email submissions will be discontinued.** Visit the [Clerk's website](#) or call before visiting as many transactions handled by the Clerk's Office do not require a personal appearance.

Docket Information

Effective Monday, June 8, 2020, Chesterfield Circuit Court will be operating at full capacity. All jury trials remain suspended until further order from the Supreme Court of Virginia. Video pre-trials for defendants held in Chesterfield County Jail will remain at 9:00am. Video pre-trials for Riverside and all other holding facilities will be at 9:30am. Remote hearings and appearances can be requested using the [Motion for Remote Hearing](#) form and will be considered on a case by case basis by the presiding judge. Requestors must coordinate their request with all parties prior to submitting it to the Court. It is the responsibility of the requestor to ensure all remote parties have the technology necessary to participate. Testing of remote connections prior to the hearing date is encouraged. Judicial settlement conferences may resume; however, meeting space in the courthouse will not be available until September 1, 2020.

Marriage Licenses	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Issued by appointment only as staff resources and public health concerns and building restrictions allow • Marriage license applicants must apply online • For marriages taking place in Virginia, licenses can be issued by any Circuit Court Clerk's Office in Virginia
Notary Commissions	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Notaries with commissions issued between 1/13/2020-April 2020 will be granted an extended time for claiming the commission and taking their oath. Per the Secretary of the Commonwealth, this date is 6/19/2020. Clarifications on expiration dates or status of application processing should be posed to the Secretary of the Commonwealth directly (804-786-2441) • May be claimed in person after Notary receives confirmation of issuance from the Secretary of the Commonwealth
Probate/Estate Qualifications	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Qualification of fiduciaries who are appointed by the Court during the term of the judicial emergency will occur as practical immediately following emergency hearings

	<ul style="list-style-type: none">• Probate assistance will be provided by phone (804-768-7680). If leaving a message and be patient as we work to return calls.• Drop-box available at the Courts Building between 8:00-4:00 M-F for recordations such as Lists of Heirs, Real Estate Affidavits, and Affidavits of Notice.• Please call ahead before visiting the courthouse to avoid a wasted trip. Most actions require significant advanced preparation.
